August – We have many new weavers and with that in mind our own Patty Huffer did a program on Drafts & Drawdowns . It was an overview on how to read a draft and the basics of dissecting a draft and how the draft can be turned and twisted. Great review for experienced weavers as well.

September - Techniques for creating cords were explored, braid, knot, i-cord, knit, use Kumihimo disk and twist. We created cords for our name badges with so many new members we were running short.
